#### **Snapshot Highlights**

Tax revenues (City & PICA) for November totaled almost \$175 million, which is a two percent increase over last November. A breakdown of the total revenues included \$142.5 million into the General Fund and \$32.1 million as the PICA portion.

Wage/Earnings/NPT (City & PICA) collections for the month totaled \$132.9 million. a six percent increase over the same month last year. Yearly collections for this tax category have totaled almost \$693 million

Monthly sales tax collections for November totaled \$11.6 million, an almost 50 percent decrease compared to last November. Yearly collections have totaled \$77 million, an almost 30 percent decrease over last year.


Along with reviewing monthly tax revenues, the Controller's Economic Report includes a review of City expenditures paid to entities that provide services and resources from Fiscal Year 2014 through Fiscal Year 2015. Of the almost \$5.7 billion in expenditures, more than \$4 billion, or 70 percent, went to entities located within the City.

A large portion of the locally expended dollars went to entities located in the Center City and West Philadelphia areas. The highest paid entity, Community Behavioral Health Services located on East Market Street, received \$1.2 billion during the period reviewed. Other areas where large amounts of expenditures went included the Far Northeast (19116 and 19154), a section of North Philadelphia around Hunting Park, Germantown, and neighborhoods around the Southwest.






According to PICA, collections for a single month can be a misleading indicator due to monthly variability in collections

#### **Business Outlook Survey**

According to the Federal Reserve's latest Manufacturing Business Outlook Survey, current conditions posted significant declines over the last month across all major indicators.

The diffusion index, the broadest measure of current conditions, decreased by 16 points over the last month to a

reading of 24.5. The new orders index decreased 20 points, from a reading of 35.7 to 15.7. Shipments dropped 16 points, from 31.9 to 16.1. Additionally, the current employment index fell 15 points.

While future indexes remained in the positive, manufacturers' responses

indicated declines over the last month. Future indicators also realized decreases over the last month but indexes remained in the positive. This included the following: general index for future activity, -6 points; new orders and shipments, -3 points; and future employment, -10 points.


#### Majority of City's Expenditures Stays Local

70% of City's Payments Went to Entities Located within Philadelphia

The City of Philadelphia relies on thousands of businesses, individuals and other entities to provide a wide range of services to meet the needs of all Philadelphians. In addition, these entities supply the City with resources that are essential for it to properly function on a daily basis.

Since July 2013 (FY2014) through the end of November 2014 (FY2015), the City expended at least \$5.7 billion to entities that provided services and resources to the City. This total includes payments to companies that administer the various employee health care plans, financial institutions that manage city accounts, the School District of Philadelphia, non-profits, legal services and hundreds of other industry areas.

Of the total amount paid to entities, more than \$4 billion, or 70 percent, is paid to entities with offices and/ or mailing addresses within the City. A large portion of the locally expended



dollars went to entities located in Center City and West Philadelphia. The highest paid entity, Community Behavioral Services located Health on East Market Street, received \$1.2 billion during the period reviewed. Other areas where large amounts of expenditures went included the Far Northeast (19116 and 19154), a section of North Philadelphia around Hunting Park, Germantown, and neighborhoods around the Southwest.

Of the almost \$1.7 billion that was not expended within the City, more than \$650 million went to entities located in Pennsylvania and the remaining \$1 billion went to those located across the country, as well as outside
